

# HOW TO START SIGNING



Start by picking <u>one sign</u> to start working on. This will keep things easy and manageable for both you and your little one.

Then introduce that sign with our 1, 2, 3 Signing Success System below.

Repeat every day.

#### **Choosting Your Family's First Signs**

Let's learn some perfect starter signs that you can pick from:

- 1. MORE
- 2. **UP**
- 3. **DOWN**
- 4. MILK
- 5. **MOM**
- 6. **DAD**
- 7. FINISHED / ALL DONE

## MORE

Tap hands together with fingers connected to thumbs repeatedly.





### THE MORE WE GET TOGETHER

The more we get together
Together, together
The more we get together
The happier we'll be.
Because your friends are my
friends
And my friends are your friends
The more we get together
The happier we'll be.

Point index fingers up





DOWN
Point index
fingers
down







#### **ROLY POLY**

Roly poly, roly poly
Up, up, up!
Up, up, up!
Roly roly poly
Roly roly poly
Down, down, down
Down, down, down.

## MILK Open and close one hand into a

fist repeatedly





Let's practice with a song:



#### THIS IS THE WAY

This is the way we have some milk, Have some milk, have some milk, This is the way we have some milk, Together everyday.

## MOM

Tap the thumb of your open flat hand to your chin



## DAD

Tap the thumb of your open flat hand to your forehead





#### **HAVE YOU EVER**

Have you ever seen my mommy
My mommy, my mommy
Have you ever seen my mommy
Go this way and that?
We go this way and that way
And this way and that way
Have you ever seen my mommy
Go this way and that?

## **ALL DONE/FINISHED**

Hold both open flat hands facing toward you, then turn them outwards





#### THIS IS THE WAY

This is the way we say all done We say all done, we say all done This is the way we we say all done Together everyday.

## THE 1, 2, 3, SIGNING SYSTEM

- 2. Sign the word as you say it to your baby.
- 3. Make what you are saying and signing happen.



This systematic approach will allow you to expose your baby to both verbal languages and sign language, as well as help you create consistent signing moments for easy learning.

Use your chosen sign right when it is happening or about to happen. For example, sign MILK as you sit down to have a bottle or nurse, or MORE as you give more of something.

Then, repeat, repeat this pattern of presenting the signs you've chosen to create a new habit.

Your baby will begin to notice the repetition and recognize the context to learn what that sign means.

#### Remember:

Think of the PATTERNS in your day, and how you can create a predictable moment when you say, sign, and do.

#### **Example:**

- Every time you have MILK, say/sign/do MILK just as it's about to happen.
- When you're about to pick baby UP, say/sign/do a pick UP.

Don't worry about "teaching" the signs, just use them yourself. Your baby will notice and learn better from you signing than from being actively "taught".

You'll also gain more traction by focusing on signs that your baby is interested in.



Singing and playing music at home are easy but powerful ways to practice signs at home!
